CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR ADMISSION TO THE SECOND CYCLE DEGREE PROGRAMME (LAUREA MAGISTRALE) IN: BIOMEDICAL OMICS (LM-9) ACADEMIC YEAR 2024/2025

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A selection for admission to Master programme in Biomedical Omics (CLASS LM-9) for the 2024/2025 academic year is issued.

The selection will take place in three sessions, as detailed below. For **European citizens** (and equivalent): Spring and September sessions. For non-European candidates residing abroad applying for a visa: Spring session.

The selection will be based on the score obtained at the interview for both EU and non-EU applicants.

Art. 1 - Deadlines summary

European citizens (and equivalent) - September Session

For **European citizens (and equivalent)**, each session will contribute to covering the available position as follows:

- 15 positions will be assigned in the **Spring session**, which will include candidates who apply by 28 May 2024.
- 15 positions will be assigned in the **September session**, which will include candidates who apply between 4 July to 6 September 2024.

Candidates who **withdraw** from the Spring admission interview can re-apply for the September session. In this case, they must submit a new online application within the indicated deadline, and carry out the entire selection process in September.

Candidates who pass the selection in the Spring session but **do not enroll within the deadline** can re-apply for the September session and enroll **within 25 September 2024** only if there are positions available.

Candidates who are eligible in the Spring session but do not reach the top 15 positions will be included in the September ranking.

Positions that are not assigned in the Spring session will be made available in the September session.

Non-EU candidates must pass the selection in the Spring session to be admitted to the programme.



Art. 2 - Admission requirements

The requirement to access the Master programme in Biomedical omics for students with Italian degrees are:

- Graduates in classes L-2 (Biotechnology), L-13 (Biological sciences), L-27 (Chemistry), L-29 (Pharmaceutical sciences and technologies), or equivalent foreign qualification for a total of 180 ECTS;
- Graduates in classes other than those listed above provided they have at least 40 ECTS in the following scientific disciplinary sectors: BIO/06, BIO/08, BIO/09, BIO/10, BIO/11, BIO/12, BIO/13, BIO/14, BIO/15, BIO/16, BIO/17, BIO/18, BIO/19, CHIM/01, CHIM/02, CHIM/03, CHIM/06, CHIM/07, CHIM/08, CHIM/09, MED/01, MED/02, MED/03, MED/04, MED/05, MED/07, MED/08, MED/43, MED/44, MED/46, MED/50, SECS S/01, SECS S/02.

Candidates must also be proficient in written and spoken English, therefore a certification of **B2 level** is required.

Students who do not meet the requirement by 31 December 2024 will not be admitted to the Master's degree programme and cannot sit further tests.

Students with qualification gained abroad must have a Bachelor's degree in one of the disciplines described above (Biotechnology, Biology, Chemistry, Pharmaceutical sciences). The number of hours/credits of the specific courses must be clearly identifiable in the academic curriculum. If this is not possible, documents certifying the students' career will be examined by the Faculty to assess if their background complies with the admission requirements.

Art. 3 - Number of places available

The number of places available for the first year is determined as follows:

- 30 places for European and equivalent citizens
- 5 places for non-European candidates residing abroad applying for a visa

Art. 4 - Admission procedure and deadline

Applications for EU and equivalent students will be accepted from 14 March to 28 May 2024 at 2.00 p.m. for the Spring session, and from 4 July to 6 September 2024 at 2.00 p.m. for the September session.

Applications for non-European candidates residing abroad applying for a visa will be accepted from 14 March to 28 May 2024 at 2.00 p.m.

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All candidates are required to apply online, according to the following procedure:

- register on the University portal
 https://registrazione.unimi.it/reg_utenti_esterni/ENG/registrazione/form.html
 (not required for those already registered on the portal or in possession of university login credentials or SPID);
- log in the online services for admission to Master programmes with an entrance examination, using university credentials or SPID:
 https://www.unimi.it/en/study/student-services/technology-and-online-services/online-services-former-sifa;
- 3. choose the programme:
 - BIOMEDICAL OMICS and fill the online application with the requested data
 or
 - BIOMEDICAL OMICS (VISA) for VISA applicants only.
- 4. pay the fee of € 30.00 by the deadline for admission at the very latest, on pain of exclusion.

The online admission service also requires the following documents to be uploaded, in .jpg, .pdf or .rtf format:

- All candidates
 - CV
 - English certificate if already available
- Candidates with foreign qualifications
 - Diploma Supplement or, alternatively, one or more official certificates confirming the qualification obtained or that the candidate is enrolled on a degree programme, as well as the exams passed, with grades and credits, issued by the University of origin. These documents must be in Italian, English, French, Spanish or German;
 - Passport (only the page with personal data) or other valid identity document.
- Graduates/future graduates of other Italian Universities
 - self-certification of first cycle degree/enrolment with exams. The document must contain a list of the exams taken, with grades, dates, credits and scientific- disciplinary sectors.

Candidates who have not yet graduated will also be required to provide the total credits obtained, the average grade, exams taken and not yet recorded with the relative credits, exams not yet taken with the relative credits, and the expected date of graduation.



A receipt is issued at the end of the online admission procedure, which can be requested on the day of the test together with the receipt of payment.

The receipt is the only document accepted as proof of registration for the admission exam.

Any candidate who provides false details or is not in possession of the admission requirements will be excluded from the final ranking list.

Art. 5 - Admission interviews and assessment criteria

The admission interviews (in English) for European and equivalent candidates will take place on 31 may 2024 and 10 September 2024. Interviews will be scheduled from 9 am to 5 pm, and will be held in presence at Polo didattico in via Noto 8, Milan. Interviews can also be held online for candidates unable to reach Milan. Instructions and rules to access the online interviews will be sent to the interested candidates in due time.

The admission interviews (in English) for **non-European candidates** residing abroad applying for a visa will take place **online** on **31 May 2024**. Instructions and rules to access the online interviews will be sent to the interested candidates in due time.

The timetable of the interviews will be communicated to the candidates after the application deadline. Notification will be sent via email to the address entered during the admission application.

The interview will last up to 20 minutes and it is aimed at verifying the abovementioned skills. The overall evaluation will give rise to a score in hundredths, in which they will be attributed:

- up to 25/100 for the degree grade;
- up to 10/100 for the curriculum of studies (type of degree, any free courses attended/passed, other diplomas, etc.);
- up to 65/100 for the outcome of the interview.

The minimum admission score is 60/100. The negative result obtained in the admission interview of personal preparation leads to foreclosure access to the Master's Degree Course for the current year.

Candidates will be required to show a valid identity document (preferably the one indicated during the online application).

Art. 6 - Ranking lists publication, enrolment and updating

6.1 - Ranking lists publication

The ranking lists will be published on the University website on 6 June 2024 after 2 p.m. (Spring session, EU and equivalent candidates), 12 September 2024 after 2 p.m. (September session, EU and equivalent candidates) or 6 June 2024 after 2 p.m. (non-European candidates residing abroad applying for a visa) on the University's website at the page: https://www.unimi.it/en/study/student-services/technology-and-online-services-former-sifa (Admission and Ranking Lists - Degree Programmes).

Non-EU candidates applying for Visa will be placed in a separate ranking list, to cover the reserved places indicated at art. 3.

Publication of the ranking lists constitutes official communication to the candidates. Candidates will not receive any communication. They must personally consult the enrolment deadlines, updating of the ranking lists and every other information published on the webpage of the chosen degree course.

6.2 - Enrolment and updating of the ranking lists

Candidates who, based on the number of places available, are winners, must enrol within the deadlines indicated in Article 1 using the online <u>Master's Degree Enrolment</u> Service accessible directly from the ranking page.

Graduands will be admitted with reserve until graduation, which must take place by 31 December 2024:

- Graduands enrolled in a degree course of this University will receive at their University email address the form to be returned to the Segreteria Studenti within the enrolment deadline, using the Informastudenti Service https://www.unimi.it/en/study/student-services/welcome-desk-informastudenti.
- Graduands from other universities must enroll by accessing the <u>online Enrolment</u>
 <u>Service</u> and communicate their degree data by accessing the <u>Enrolment</u>
 <u>Confirmation Online Service</u> by 31 December 2024.

Failure to enrol within the deadlines and in the manner provided will be considered an automatic renunciation.

Places left vacant after the deadline for enrolment are assigned to the next students in the ranking list and will be published as indicated in point 10 on the University's website at the following page: https://www.unimi.it/en/study/student-services/technology-and-online-services/online-services-former-sifa (On line services former SIFA - Admission and Ranking Lists).



Art. 7 - Candidates with qualifications gained abroad

All details on qualifications and access for international students to Italian universities are published on the website http://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/ and on the University website in the sections dedicated to international students.

The eligibility of foreign qualifications is in any case assessed by the University, in accordance with applicable ministerial guidelines and bilateral agreements.

Applicants with qualifications gained abroad will be required to submit compulsorily the following documents during the online enrolment application:

- Admission fee receipt;
- Copy of High school diploma legalized by the authorities of the issuing country, with an official Italian translation;
- First cycle degree (BSc. or equivalent) legalized by the authorities of the issuing country, with an official Italian translation (translation not required when the Diploma Supplement is provided);
- Statement of validity (Dichiarazione di Valore in loco) issued by the Italian
 Embassy in the country where the qualification was obtained or CIMEA <u>Statement of Comparability</u> or Statement of validity issued by other ENIC-NARIC centres. If available, the <u>Statement of Correspondence</u> processed through the <u>ARDI platform</u>, together with the <u>Statement of Verification</u> issued by CIMEA, replace the CIMEA <u>Statement of Comparability</u>.
- Copy of a valid Residence permit (only for non-EU citizens);
- Italian tax code;
- Identity document (passport or EU ID).

Upper secondary school diplomas, post-secondary and university certificates are accepted in Italian as well as in French, English, German or Spanish.

The certified translation of the university degree and the related Declaration of Value/statement of validity can be replaced by the Diploma Supplement issued by the universities of countries belonging to the European Higher Education Area.

In addition to these documents, **non-EU students applying for a visa** are required to submit the following:

- Universitaly pre-enrolment application receipt;
- Student visa.

Candidates who do not hold the required documentation when enrolling have to submit it **by 28 November 2024** through the dedicated online service available on the International enrolment in degree programmes page.



The validity of international qualifications is verified upon submission of the official documents. Until then, candidates are admitted to the programme conditionally, and may be rejected if they are found not to meet the requirements.

7.1 - Non-EU Candidates Applying for a Visa

All students falling under this category are required to submit an application for preenrolment through Universitaly within 31 July 2024.

These candidates can enrol only if included in the quota of reserved places.

Art. 8 - Examining board

The examining board is appointed by the competent academic council.

During the exam the board will be assisted by staff, who will be responsible for supervising and identifying the candidates.
