**CALL FOR APPLICATIONS TO THE FIRST CYCLE DEGREE PROGRAMME IN:
ECONOMICS: BEHAVIOR, DATA AND POLICY (CLASS L-33 R)
ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027**

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A call for applications to the Bachelor's degree programme in Economics: behavior, data and policy (Class L-33 R) for the 2026/2027 academic year is issued.

The selection takes place in one session open to all candidates.

Candidates must comply with all the procedures and deadlines set out below.

Art. 1 - Deadlines and steps summary

Art. 2 - Admission requirements

Candidates are admitted to the selection if they have sat the [Cisia English Test-Sciences \(CEnT-S\) provided by Cisia](#) and have applied on the University website within the deadlines set out in Art. 1.

Art. 3 - Number of places available

The number of places available is determined as follows:

100 places plus 15 places for non-EU students residing abroad (VISA applicants).



Art. 4 - CEnT-S registration and application

To take part in the selections, candidates must apply online and sit the test within the deadlines set out in Art. 1.

a) CEnT- S registration on the CISIA website

To sit the Test CEnT-S, candidates must follow the procedure below:

- register on the CISIA website:
https://testcisia.it/studenti_tolc/login_studente_tolc.php?l=gb;
- Register for the Test through the CISIA portal, choosing any available location and one of the available dates within the deadlines set, as indicated in art. 1. The calendar with the available dates is published here:

- pay the amount of 55,00 euros according to the procedures set out by CISIA.

b.1) Application on the University website - for candidates with qualifications obtained in Italy

To enter the ranking list, all candidates with an Italian qualification must apply on our University website, within the deadline established in Art.1, following the procedure below:

1. register on the University website through the page
<https://www.unimi.it/registrazione/ENG/registra.keb> (not required for those already registered on the website or with university login credentials or SPID);
2. access the online admission service using their UNIMI credentials or SPID:
<https://studente.unimi.it/ammissioni/a/primoLivello/checkLogin.asp>;
3. select the programme and fill the online application with the requested data;
4. upload the English language proficiency certificate, if any.

b.2) Application on the platform dedicated to international students - for candidates with qualifications obtained abroad

To enter the ranking list, candidates with a foreign qualification must apply on the dedicated online platform, within the deadline established in Art.1, following the procedure below:

1. register on <https://apply.unimi.it/>;
2. select the programme;
3. upload the documents indicated in Article 10, from point 1 to point 5.



At the end of the procedure - b.1) for candidates with qualifications obtained in Italy, b.2) for candidates with qualifications obtained abroad - a receipt is issued as proof of the admission application.

The online admission form cannot be amended, nor can it be completed with additional documents once it has been submitted.

Any applicant who provides false details or lacks any requirements will be excluded from the final ranking list. When applying, there is no need to upload the score of the CEnT-S test as it will be collected automatically from the Cisia database.

Art. 5 - Admission exam and ranking criteria

The CEnT-S is aimed at assessing the educational background required for access to Bachelor's programmes. It encompasses 55 multiple-choice questions divided into the following sections:

- Mathematics - 15 questions in 30 minutes.
- Reasoning on texts and data - 15 questions in 30 minutes;
- Biology - 10 questions in 20 minutes;
- Chemistry - 10 questions in 20 minutes;
- Physics - 5 questions in 10 minutes.

The admission exam answers are scored as follows:

- 1 point for each correct answer;
- -0.25 points for each wrong answer;
- 0 points for not given answers.

Both ranking lists (UE and VISA applicants) will be exclusively based on the score obtained in the following two sections: “Mathematics” (15 questions) and “Reasoning on texts and data” (15 questions). Students interested in applying to the Bachelor's degree programme in Economics: behavior, data and policy (Class L-33) should therefore ignore and skip the sections on Biology, Chemistry and Physics. When finalizing the ranking, candidates may be subject to further evaluation in the form of tests and/or interviews.

In the event of equal point scores, priority is given to the candidate with better scores in the *Mathematics* test section. In the event of a further equal point scores, priority is given to the younger candidate.

The test can be taken more than once, but no more than once in each macro-period. It is valid if carried out remotely (CEnT@CASA) or in person from 1° november 2025 to the deadline set out in Art. 1.



In any case the **best** CEnT-S test outcome will be considered valid for the purposes of the selection.

Art. 6 - Students from other programmes or universities, and graduates

Students aiming to transfer to Economics: Behavior, Data and Policy from other University programmes, in Italy or abroad, as well as graduates, are required to take the admission test and follow the procedure outlined in Art. 5.

Art. 7 - Ranking list publication, enrolment and updating

7.1 Ranking list publication

The ranking list will be published on the University website at:

<http://studente.unimi.it/ammissioni/g/graduatoriaprogrammati/checkLogin.asp> as scheduled in Art. 1, after 2.00 p.m.

Publication of the ranking list is official notice to those concerned. Candidates will not receive any communication. They must personally check enrolment deadlines, ranking lists, any additional learning requirements (“OFA” - see art. 8) or other information posted to the webpage of the degree programme.

Non-EU candidates applying for a Visa, will be placed in a separate ranking list formed with the same rules and with the same minimum requirements described in Art. 5, to cover the places set aside as per art. 3. These candidates can enrol only if included in the quota of reserved places.

7.2 Enrolment and updating

Based on the number of places available, place winners of the competitions must enrol through the online *Enrolment service* at:

<https://studente.unimi.it/immatricolazioni/primolivello/checkLogin.asp>, within the deadline set out in art. 1, selecting the type of enrollment (first enrollment / already graduated student / student transferred from another university).

Enrolment for candidates who applied as graduands takes place in two steps:

reservation of the enrolment immediately after the publication of the ranking list and confirmation once obtained their secondary school qualification. Confirmation of enrolment must be made from 15 July to 3 August 2026, 2:00 pm (GMT +2) by accessing the appropriate online service at the page:

<https://studente.unimi.it/confermalm>. **Until the confirmation, candidates are admitted to the programme conditionally.**

Graduand winners who do not reserve and confirm their enrolment by the date and time specified in art.1 tacitly waive their place.

During the enrolment reservation, place winners will have to pay **146 Euros** as



the first instalment of tuition fees. This fee must be paid within the pre-enrolment deadline set out in Art. 1 and is non-refundable.

Winners who do not enrol by the date and time specified in art.1 (i.e. before the updates of the ranking list) tacitly waive their place.

Candidates already enrolled in a UNIMI course will have to renew their enrolment and submit an internal transfer application using the procedure on the page:

7.3 Ranking updates

In the event of places left vacant after the enrolment deadline, the ranking list will be updated until all places are allocated, or until there are no applicants with the minimum score.

Admitted applicants must enrol within the deadlines set out in art. 1.

Art. 8 - Remedial course (“OFA”)

Candidates who are admitted into the programme despite having scored less than 10 normalised points in the Mathematics section will be assigned additional learning requirements (“Obblighi Formativi Aggiuntivi - OFA”). This means that they will have to read supplementary materials and pass another Mathematics test within their first year in the programme. If they fail to do so, they will not be allowed to take any second- and/or third-year exams.

8.1 English OFA

To successfully participate in the Bachelor’s programme, students must be proficient in English at a B2 level as per the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This proficiency level may be certified as follows:

- through a language certificate, earned within three years prior to the date of submission, at a B2 level or higher. The list of language certificates recognized by the

The certificate can be uploaded while completing the enrolment procedure or at a later time through the portal <http://studente.unimi.it/uploadCertificazioniLingue>;

- through a high-school diploma with English as teaching language. The diploma must be uploaded while completing the enrolment procedure;

- through a Placement Test that must be taken by the end of October 2026. The test is delivered online by the Language Centre of the University of Milan (SLAM). Students who fail the test will be required to take a SLAM course. The Placement Test is mandatory for all students who do not hold a valid certificate or a secondary school diploma with English as teaching language. Students who do not take the Placement Test by October 2026 and students who, after a maximum of six attempts, fail to pass the SLAM end-of-course test must obtain a recognized certificate in order to register and be allowed to sit any exam included in the programme.

Fulfilment of the English OFA is a mandatory condition to sit any exam of the programme.

Art. 9 - Request for additional time and/or specific aids or compensatory tools for candidates with invalidity, disability or diagnosed with SLD

Candidates with invalidity, disability or specific learning disabilities (SLD) can request an admission test with additional time and/or personalized supports by submitting **when registering for the CEnT-S test on the CISIA portal:**

- certification of civil invalidity and/or recognition of the state of handicap pursuant to law 104/1992 for candidates with disabilities;
- for candidates with specific learning disabilities (SLD), SLD certificates must be issued by the National Health Service, by an authorized private medical team or by a private specialist pursuant to Law 170/2010, and must be accompanied by a document of compliance issued by the competent health authority (if the applicant was a minor when the certificate was issued, documents older than three years will not be accepted).

Candidates can be admitted to the test with the medical certification they possess, even if not updated due to the limitation for the Covid-19 emergency, an integration of the documentation expected will be requested.

Applicants from EU countries and non-EU countries residing abroad with invalidity, disability or with SLD who intend to take advantage of personalized supports, must submit certification (legalized, where required by current international standards) attesting the status of invalidity, disability or DSA issued in the country of residence, accompanied by a translation, sworn or certified by the Italian diplomatic missions, conforming to the original text, in Italian or in English.

Art. 10 - Applicants with qualifications obtained abroad

Foreign educational qualifications are valid if obtained after 12 years of schooling and if they allow admission to a university in the country where they were awarded. The suitability of the foreign qualification is in any case evaluated by the University in compliance with ministerial regulations on the matter and according to applicable bilateral agreements.

Candidates holding a foreign qualification must enroll through the dedicated online service <https://studente.unimi.it/immatricolazioni/primoLivello/checkLogin.asp> within the deadlines set out in Article 1 and upload the required documentation to the platform dedicated to international students apply.unimi.it:

Candidates holding foreign qualifications are required to upload the following documents when completing the online enrolment process:

1. High school diploma, legalized or apostilled by the authorities of the country that issued the qualification, except in cases where the law provides for exemptions from legalization and the Hague Apostille;
2. Official translation into Italian of the qualification (not required if the original is in French, English, German, or Spanish);
3. Certificate of academic eligibility, if required in the country of origin;
4. Certificate of university enrollment with transcript of records, or a post-secondary qualification obtained at a non-university higher education institution, or a certificate of completion of a foundation year, if the local school system is shorter than 12 years;
5. Any other document proving specific validity requirements of the qualification (e.g., APs for U.S. qualifications, A-levels for U.K. qualifications);
6. Statement of Comparability issued by an ENIC-NARIC center, such as [CIMEA](#), or a Declaration of Value (Dichiarazione di Valore in loco - DOV) issued by the Italian Embassy in the country where the diploma was obtained. For the [55 signatory countries of the Lisbon Convention](#), the Correspondence Statement generated through the ARDI platform may replace the DOV and the Statement of Comparability;
7. Italian tax code (codice fiscale);
8. Receipt of the residence permit application or a valid residence permit (for non-EU citizens only).



All documentation must be completed by 30 November 2026. After this date, enrollment will be cancelled unless documented reasons beyond the candidate's control are provided.

The University may request additional documents if necessary. Final verification of the qualification's validity is carried out only after receiving all official documents. Until then, candidates are admitted to the programme conditionally, and the candidate may be excluded if they do not meet the required criteria.

10.1 Non-EU candidates applying for a Visa

For the Economics: behavior, data and policy programme there is a reserved quota of **15 places** for non-EU candidates applying for visa.

All students falling under this category are required to submit an application for pre-enrolment through [Universitaly](#) platform by **31 July 2026**. Applications submitted after this date will not be accepted, even if complete. Failure to comply with the deadline automatically results in exclusion from the selection process and from enrollment.

Candidates who submit their application by 31 July may update or supplement it at any later time, but the initial submission must be made before the deadline.
