CHARACTERISTICS OF DEGREE PROGRAMME

General and specific learning objectives

The Master's Degree Programme in Law provides focussed and specialised training, with a systematic and methodological approach, in the field of legal institutions. The breadth of the programme is both national and international, and it is interdisciplinary in scope. In-class learning will include, in addition to lectures, a discussion section intended to explore the students reading comprehension and ability to analyse legal scholarship and case opinions. With a focus on international issues, the Law programme offers a number of English-language classes, and a broad selection of study-abroad programmes which, along with the Erasmus + exchange programme, contemplate participation in a double degree programme, summer school, moot courts, and internships with major law firms and international institutions.

Expected learning outcomes

Graduates of the Law programme acquire:

- a baseline knowledge in Italian, European, international and transnational legal foundations, as well as general principles and foundations of positive law;
- an in-depth knowledge of Italian law at all levels, and the interconnections between the same;
- a solid understanding of the historic dimensions of the law, and diachronic evolution of legal institutions;
- an appreciation of comparative law and foundations of positive law;
- an understanding of how to position legal phenomena within the broader context of socio-economic dynamics;
- an in-depth understanding of the legal methods and rules, and how to perform legal analysis and criticism accordingly.

Legal training, and the mastery of certain methodologies and tools intrinsic to the legal profession, allow the graduates of the Law programme to translate their knowledge into the skills required of the legal professions, both in a traditional sense (barrister, judge, notary, and the like), and through the application of legal expertise in other fields, including public administration, HR consultancy, diplomacy, international organisations, business, independent supervisory authorities, as well as in more innovative areas of economic and social development, not traditionally viewed as a career in the law.

Moreover, within the scope of various disciplinary areas (private law and public law, criminal law, international and European law, legal history, philosophy, sociology, and Law & Economics), graduates of this programme will gain the ability to:

- understand legal texts, and how to correctly interpret them;
- identify, within a complex array of sources, the authority to resolve a legal dispute.
- the ability to identify questions of law, to structure them methodically, and to propose solutions which are procedurally and substantively valid;
- the ability to draft legal documents (laws and regulations, court / administrative orders and opinions, legal treatises, etc.) which abide by the principles of structural and formal cohesion, and properly state the law;
- the ability to provide a legal perspective on social issues and scientific questions, applying legal knowledge to real-world issues faced by institutions and companies;
- the ability to identify ways that the law might solve some of the 21st century's most challenging problems.

These objectives are pursued not only through lectures, but also through a variety of learning modules, laboratories, and seminars, law clinics, internships, and work experiences, providing an excellent balance of traditional learning and interactive learning by doing.

Professional profile and employment opportunities

The Master's degree programme in Law prepares students to launch a traditional career in the field, as attorney magistrate or notary, whilst providing students with the opportunity to explore a number of other law-related career paths, for which a thorough knowledge of law is required - either in a self-employed capacity or as salaried employees.

Professional opportunities for those earning this degree may be summarised, in a very general way, using the ISTAT professional classification as follows:

Attorneys

- Role in the workforce: The professions included in this category represent and safeguard the interests of individuals and organisations in legal proceedings, and at the various levels of civil, criminal, and administrative actions; they draft deeds, contracts, and other legal documents; they provide legal advice and counsel; they act as Arbitrator and mediator in an

alternative-dispute-resolution setting.

- Skills associated with this role: students on this track must possess adequate knowledge in the field of civil, criminal, administrative, and tax matters.
- Employment opportunities: Legal practice, upon completion of the legal-apprenticeship period with a law firm (this requirement may be fulfilled, in part, through enrolment in the Postgraduate School of Legal Professions) and passing the State Exam to be able to practice law.

Notaries

- Role in the workforce: Generate and record inter vivos and testamentary deeds; notarise the same; retain them; issue copies, excerpts, and certifications for the same; determine the intent of the contracting parties, and memorialise such intent in writing, ensuring the lawfulness of the deed or other official document resulting there from; recommend the proper legal instrument for the parties to reach their goals; vet the legal compliance of the content of any resulting agreement or transaction.
- Skills associated with this role: These professionals must possess adequate knowledge in the field of legal affairs, civil, zoning, tax, international, and EU law in particular.
- Employment opportunities: solo practitioner or member of a firm, upon completion of an apprenticeship through a notary's offices (which requirement may be met through enrolment in the Postgraduate School of Legal Professions) and passing the state exam for notaries.

Magistrates

- Role in the workforce: Adjudicate criminal, civil, and administrative matters at various levels of proceedings; oversee criminal procedure and exercise the power of the State in criminal proceedings; conduct judicial review of public expenditures under current statutes and regulations.
- Skills associated with this role: These professionals must possess adequate knowledge in the field of civil, criminal, administrative, international, and EU law.
- Employment opportunities: Courts of ordinary, administrative, and tax regulation, upon passing the State Exam.

Corporate legal affairs personnel

- Role in the workforce: These professionals address, manage, and coordinate operations through designated offices regarding the legal aspects of a business (especially in regulated professions: banking, insurance, and financial intermediation); they generate deeds, contracts, and other legal documents; they provide consulting on legal matters within their assigned department or division.
- Skills associated with this role: These professionals must possess solid knowledge in the legal field, civil, criminals and tax matters in particular.
- Employment opportunities: Employment in corporate legal affairs offices.

Public administration legal affairs personnel

- Role in the workforce: These professionals address, manage, and coordinate operations through designated offices regarding the legal aspects of their public agency or entity, or the Public Administration at large; they generate deeds, contracts, and other legal documents; they provide consulting on legal matters within their assigned department or division.
- Skills associated with this role: These professionals must possess solid knowledge in the legal field, administrative matters in particular.
- Employment opportunities: legal affairs departments within entities of public administration, national and supranational public entities, and industry supervisory authorities (Bank of Italy, Consob, Ivass, Italian Antitrust Authority, Pension Fund Supervisory Commission, Data Protection Authority, Energy and Natural Gas Authority, etc.), upon passing the state examination.

Initial knowledge required

Admission requirements

Qualifications and skills required for admission

Admission into the Master's Degree Programme in Law is conditional upon earning a secondary, high-school, or college-preparatory diploma, or other equivalent foreign diploma, and suitable recognised educational qualifications. Enrolment in the programme is not capped.

Admission assessment

The Faculty requires a non-binding self-assessment test (CISIA Consortium TOLC-SU). This is mandatory for all students, and intended to educate students on the choice they are making, assess their educational background, especially their general baseline of knowledge, and their reasoning and logic abilities. The dates and procedures for the test will be provided in the general call for applications.

Additional learning requirements (OFA)

Students may matriculate regardless of their test results. Students scoring less than 20/50 on the first three sections or less than 12/30 in the Reading comprehension and Italian language portion of the test will be assigned additional learning requirements (OFA) aimed at filling these gaps. The OFA must be satisfied within the first year of the programme through the remedial work contemplated by the University. Information on OFA procedures and failure to complete the OFA will be

provided on the degree programme's webpage.

English-language OFA Proficiency Level B2

In order to sit the English-language exam required by the study plan, students must be proficient in English at B2 level under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This proficiency level may be certified as follows:

- Through a language certificate, earned within three years prior to the date of submission, at B2 level or higher. For the list of language certificates recognised by the University, please review: https://www.unimi.it/en/node/297/. The certificate must be uploaded during the enrolment procedure, or subsequently to the portal http://studente.unimi.it/uploadCertificazioniLingue;
- Through a Placement Test, which is delivered by the University Language Centre (SLAM), during year I only, from October to December. Students who fail the test will be required to take a SLAM course.

The Placement Test is mandatory for all students who do not hold a valid certificate.

Those who do not sit the Placement Test by December, or who fail to pass the end-of-course test within six attempts, must obtain a paid certificate by the programme year contemplated for their exam in English.

Compulsory attendance

Class attendance is strongly recommended.

Degree programme final exams

The final exam for the Master's degree programme in Law consists in writing a thesis under the guidance of a supervisor and defending it before an examining board.

Degree theses may be of the following types:

- a) case study: the candidate will write a reasoned opinion on a practical case or problematic issue, analyzing its controversial profiles also in the light of legal and/or economic doctrine and possibly of the relevant jurisprudence, focusing on potential alternatives and illustrating their own justified solution.
- b) monographic dissertation: the candidate will organically analyze a complex topic, giving an exhaustive and methodological account of legal and/or economic literature, and possibly the relevant legislation and jurisprudence, as well as expressing their personal opinions on the subject.

Upcoming graduates must have earned 270 academic credits, as well as 3 credits for IT-legal skills and 3 credits for language skills. The final exam marks the completion of the degree programme, as well as being a formative moment for the student. It will award 24 credits.

By passing the final exam and reaching the required total of 300 credits, candidates will obtain their Master's degree in Law.

Notes

Structure of the programme

Teaching methods and structure:

The normal duration for the Master's degree programme in Law is five (5) years.

Teaching methods include both lectures and exercises performed within the scope of the same. Students are likewise expected, within the scope of the programme, to take part in supplemental learning through seminars, conferences, educational internships, both on- and off-campus.

Each one is assigned a specific number of academic credits. An academic credit is a measurement of the effort required of the student: each credit generally corresponds to twenty-five (25) hours of study, made up of seven (7) hours lectures, plus seminars (if any), exercises and additional learning, and personal study hours. The credits for each subject contemplated under the academic programme are earned by passing the related examination.

Course breakdown:

- single-discipline
- integrated coursework (administered in modules)

Submission of the study plan

Procedures and deadlines for submission

Students exercise the choices reserved to them by submitting an individual study plan, which is approved at the discretion of the Interdepartmental Academic Board.

Submission of a study plan is not required for any required examination. The study plan must, however, be submitted in order to sit for any elective examination. Furthermore, students may generate an ad-hoc study plan, subject to departmental approval. The plan must be submitted beginning in the second year, during the month of October, on those dates, and in the manner, posted by the Student Registrar's Office to the following webpage: https://www.unimi.it/it/studiare/frequentare-uncorso-di-laurea/seguire-il-percorso-di-studi/piano-studi

EXPERIENCE OF STUDY ABROAD AS PART OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM

The University of Milan supports international mobility by providing its students with the opportunity to spend study and internship periods abroad. It is a unique chance to enrich your educational path in a new exciting environment.

The agreements entered into by the University with over 300 universities from the 27 EU member countries under the European Erasmus+ programme allow regularly enrolled students to carry out part of their studies at one of the partner universities or to undertake internships at companies, training and research centres and other organizations.

Similar international mobility opportunities are provided outside Europe, through agreements with a number of prestigious institutions.

Study and internships abroad

The programme offers a wide variety of study-abroad opportunities, with a full range of coursework options. Beginning to the second year, students may study abroad at one or more European universities as part of the Erasmus+ Programme. Our University partners include: Austria (Innsbruck), Germany (Frankfurt, Costanza, Tübingen, Osnabrück, Heidelberg), Belgium (Brussels, Leuven), France (Cergy Pointoise, Montpellier, Paris, Rheims, Strasbourg, Toulouse), Finland (Helsinki), Greece (Thessaly), Great Britain (Edge Hill), Norway (Bergen), Netherlands (Nijmegen, Wageningen), Portugal (Coimbra, Lisbon, Oporto), Czech Republic (Prague), Poland (Krakow, Breslavia, Poznań), Croatia (Zagreb), Romania (Timișoara), Hungary (Budapest), Sweden (Lund), Spain (Barcelona, Castellón, Girona, Granada, Huelva, La Coruña, Lleida, Madrid, Oviedo, Pamplona, Seville, Valencia, Santiago de Compostela), Turkey (Istanbul). Students admitted into the programme pursue academic training through foreign Universities. There, they have the option to research and write their thesis, whilst benefiting from a scholarship, and earning academic credit for any exams passed or academic work completed, as well as bonus points on their final degree mark. An analogous programme is available in Switzerland through the Swiss European Mobility (Geneva, Lucerne, Freiburg).

Students also have the option of studying abroad, earning academic credit for exams and academic activities, as well as bonus points on their final degree mark, at the following non-EU Universities: U.S. (Ithaca, New York), China (Xiamen, Shanghai, Sozhou and Beijing), Japan (Kobe), Brazil (Niterói), South Korea (Seoul) and Canada (Montreal).

A double-degree programme is currently in place with the Universities of Toulouse and Cergy Pontoise (France). This programme allows top students, fluent in French, to earn both an Italian and a French Degree.

Through the Erasmus + Placement programme students have internship opportunities in Europe, beginning in Year III. Internships are currently available through businesses, law firms, or other institutions in England, Germany, Austria, Belgium, France, and Portugal. Students will enjoy, in addition to a scholarship, transfer credit for all successfully completed work, as well as bonus points on their final degree mark.

Additionally, each year the Faculty gives students a chance to be a part of a national and international Moot Court competition team. Finally, students will have the opportunity to take part in international Summer Schools.

How to participate in Erasmus mobility programs

How to participate in Erasmus+ mobility programmes

The students of the University of Milan can participate in mobility programmes, through a public selection procedure. Ad hoc commissions will evaluate:

- Academic career
- the candidate's proposed study programme abroad
- his/her foreign language proficiency
- the reasons behind his/her application

Call for applications and informative meetings

The public selection for Erasmus+ mobility for study generally begins around February each year with the publication of a call for applications specifying destinations and requirements. Regarding the Erasmus+ Mobility for Traineeship, the University of Milan usually publishes two calls a year enabling students to choose a destination defined by an interinstitutional agreement or to find a traineeship position on their own.

The University organizes informative meetings to illustrate mobility opportunities and rules for participation.

Erasmus+ scholarship

The European Union grants the winners of the Erasmus+ programme selection a scholarship to contribute to their mobility costs, which may be supplemented by the University funding for disadvantaged students.

Language courses

Students who pass the selections for mobility programmes can benefit from intensive foreign language courses offered each year by the University Language Centre (SLAM).
