### CHARACTERISTICS OF DEGREE PROGRAMME

#### General and specific learning objectives

The Master's degree programme in Modern Humanities aims to provide students with in-depth knowledge in the field of Italian literary, linguistic and philological studies, based on specialist methodological, theoretical and critical notions. Over the course of the programme students will learn to devise their own strategy for honing one of the following subjects: philology of Medieval Latin and Romance languages and literatures (including from a comparative angle); Italian linguistics (also with respect to social uses and geolinguistic issues, literary language and its formal structures); history of Italian literature (in all its problematic and critical aspects); contemporary literariness (also with reference to communication and publishing processes).

#### Expected learning outcomes

The intended learning outcomes include:

- knowledge of the structure, grammar and history of the Italian and Latin languages;
- knowledge of the methods and strategies for the analysis of literary texts;
- ability to place linguistic and literary documents within their historical and cultural context;
- ability to understand and critically analyse texts and documents;
- in-depth knowledge of the curricular disciplines (for the curriculum in Classics: literature, languages, history and archaeology of the considered periods and geo-cultural areas; for the curriculum in Modern literature: medieval literature

and languages, Italian modern and contemporary literature and language, contextualised in their historical settings and in connection with other cultural expressions of the periods under consideration);

- advanced skills in Italian written and oral expression and ability to write texts of diverse typologies and functions;
- ability to critically use bibliographical and IT tools within the specific areas of competence;
- ability to critically manage information (i.e. select and reprocess texts and data by evaluating their relevance and reliability);
- knowledge of English (B1 level).

### **Professional profile and employment opportunities**

The skills and knowledge acquired during the curricular courses as well as the experience developed through lab activities and internships are aimed at enabling graduates in Humanities to pursue professional careers in all areas which require a good knowledge of facts and cultural processes, effective writing skills, advanced specialised literary and linguistic notions, critical use of information. The envisaged career opportunities include areas such as traditional and digital publishing, journalism and text production, the promotion and organisation of cultural activities, the management of the literary and cultural heritage, human resources.

Upon completing their course of study, graduate students will have acquired the required preparation for admission to master degrees and first level master programmes. The curriculum also enables students to obtain ECTS in disciplines which are a prerequisite for a future career as secondary school teachers.

### **Notes**

English Levels B1/B2

To be able to sit for the exams included in the degree programme, students are required to demonstrate their English language proficiency at level B1 or B2 within the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). This level can be assessed in the following ways:

- language certificate achieved no more than three years prior to the submission, at level B1 or B2 or higher, recognised by the University (the list of recognised language certificates can be found at: <https://www.unimi.it/en/study/language-proficiency/placement-tests-entry-tests-and-english-courses>). The language certificate must be uploaded during the admission process;

- by taking the Placement Test organised by SLAM, exclusively during the first year, from October to December. Students who fail to reach level B1 or B2 will have to attend an English course organised by SLAM. The Placement Test is compulsory for all students who do not have a valid language certificate.

Students who do not take the Placement Test within the deadline and students who fail the SLAM end-of-course test within six attempts will have to obtain a language certificate within the final exam.

### **Computer skills**

Students who are supposed to earn 3 credits (CFU) for basic computer skills, as provided by their degree programme, have to attend the 'Computer Science Course 3CFU'.

It is a blended course with a compulsory final exam.

The first round is scheduled for January, and more will follow according to a calendar to be made available on the course delivery platform.

Students who have already fulfilled an ICT Assessment during their previous studies should submit the related certification to their degree Secretariat, seeking its acknowledgement: it will be evaluated and they will receive a positive or negative feedback.

The 'Computer Science Course 3CFU' course is managed by the CTU - Teaching and Learning Innovation and Multimedia Technology Centre.

## **EXPERIENCE OF STUDY ABROAD AS PART OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM**

The University of Milan supports international mobility by providing its students with the opportunity to spend study and internship periods abroad. It is a unique chance to enrich your educational path in a new exciting environment.

The agreements entered into by the University with over 300 universities from the 27 EU member countries and other Extra-EU countries under the European Erasmus+ programme allow regularly enrolled students to carry out part of their studies at one of the partner universities or to undertake internships at companies, training and research centres and other organizations.

Similar international mobility opportunities are provided outside Europe, through agreements with a number of prestigious institutions.

### **Study and internships abroad**

Every year the Department of Literary Studies, Philology and Linguistics offers around forty fellowships through the Erasmus exchange program. Currently, the exchanges cover many of the major countries of the European Union (France, Germany, Spain, Greece, Hungary, Poland, Czech Republic, Estonia), as well as Switzerland and the United Kingdom.

According to the scientific areas of the Department, the Erasmus exchanges are particularly addressed to students specializing in classics, in medieval, modern and contemporary Italian literature, in philology and linguistics.

### How to participate in Erasmus mobility programs

The students of the University of Milan can participate in mobility programmes, through a public selection procedure.

Ad hoc commissions will evaluate:

- Academic career
- the candidate's proposed study programme abroad
- his/her foreign language proficiency
- the reasons behind his/her application

Call for applications and informative meetings

The public selection generally begins around February each year with the publication of a call for applications specifying the destinations, with the respective programme duration (from 2/3 to 12 months), requirements and online application deadline. Every year, before the deadline for the call, the University organizes informative meetings to illustrate opportunities and rules for participation to students.

Erasmus+ scholarship

The European Union grants the winners of the Erasmus+ programme selection a scholarship to contribute to their mobility costs, which is supplemented by the University funding for disadvantaged students.

Language courses

Students who pass the selections for mobility programmes can benefit from intensive foreign language courses offered each year by the University.
