### **CHARACTERISTICS OF DEGREE PROGRAMME**

#### **General and specific learning objectives**

The course of second cycle degree in Archaeology has the objective to lead its graduates to acquire a trustworthy cultural education and reliable knowledge in the specific professional field. As to all this, the graduate will acquire:

- wide and suitable basic knowledge of the main research fields of the archaeological branch of learning, concerning the Mediterranean and European world, from Prehistory to Protohistory, from Etruscology to Greek and Roman archaeology, and to the history of ancient art;
- familiarity in using the research methodologies concerning the techniques of the archaeological excavations, the type-chronological methods of classification of the different classes of artefacts, and the analysis of the different archaeological sources;
- the skill to employ the principles of the preservation, protection and enhancement of the archaeological patrimony;
- capability to work both in an archaeological excavation site and in research institutions, of preservation, protection and enhancement of archaeological sites;
- knowledge of at least one foreign language among those of the E.U.

#### **Professional profile and employment opportunities**

The graduates in the second cycle degree Archaeology will be able to work with managerial positions in all the private and public institutions interested in the archaeological heritage. Moreover, the knowledge acquired will be the necessary qualification to go on with the studies at a higher level, so that to be in a position to take on more important responsibilities in the university field or in specific institutions such as Soprintendenze and archaeological museums.

### **EXPERIENCE OF STUDY ABROAD AS PART OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM**

The University of Milan supports the international mobility of its students, offering them the opportunity to spend periods of study and training abroad, a unique opportunity to enrich their curriculum in an international context.

#### **Study and internships abroad**

The bachelor course in Cultural Heritage and master's degree courses related has a specific notice in the Erasmus+

Programme that offers study programmes in more than twenty European universities, belonging to the following language areas: French, English, German, Spanish and Portuguese. Moreover, the programme provides stays in universities of Northern and Eastern Europe with English taught courses.

With partner universities are in force exchange agreements related to all branches of learning in the degree courses. The subject areas are: Archaeology, Art History, Performing Arts, Music and Musicology.

All partner universities offer to students “Erasmus+ outgoing” stays ranging from 3 to 10 months, where students can follow and take exams that will be recognized in their degree curriculum; they also can do research activities for the preparation of their graduation thesis, seeing it recognized within the claims covered by the exchange Programme Erasmus +.

Every year all educational activities under the programme are presented to interested students from Erasmus departmental coordinator in a special information session; all the data for the submission of educational Learning Agreement are also collected in special sheets published annually on the departmental website, where students can find detailed information about study courses, lectures and contacts.

All “Erasmus + incoming” students are given the opportunity to attend all Italian taught lectures in departmental courses. Moreover exchange students can agree with professors a program partially in English.

Also, with many partner universities are also active exchanges of teaching staff, which provide stays of our visiting professors abroad and foreign colleagues in our institution within the courses of the department.

### **How to participate in Erasmus mobility programs**

To gain access to mobility programs for study purposes, lasting 3-12 months, the enrolled students of the University of Milan must attend a public selection that starts usually around the month of February each year through the presentation of specific competition announcements, which contain information on available destinations, respective duration of the mobility, requirements and deadlines for submitting the online application.

The selection, aimed at evaluating the proposed study abroad program of the candidate, knowledge of a foreign language, especially when this is a preferential requirement, and the motivations behind the request, is performed by specially constituted commissions.

Each year, before the expiry of the competition announcements, the University organises information sessions for the specific study course or groups of study courses, in order to illustrate to students the opportunities and participation rules.

To finance stays abroad under the Erasmus + program, the European Union assigns to the selected students a scholarship that - while not covering the full cost of living abroad - is a useful contribution for additional costs as travel costs or greater cost of living in the country of destination.

The monthly amount of the communitarian scholarship is established annually at national level; additional contributions may be provided to students with disabilities.

In order to enable students in economic disadvantaged conditions to participate in Erasmus+ program, the University of Milan assigns further additional contributions; amount of this contributions and criteria for assigning them are established from year to year.

The University of Milan promotes the linguistic preparation of students selected for mobility programs, organising every year intensive courses in the following languages: English, French, German and Spanish.

The University in order to facilitate the organisation of the stay abroad and to guide students in choosing their destination offers a specific support service.
