CHARACTERISTICS OF DEGREE PROGRAMME

General and specific learning objectives

The undergraduate programme in Language Mediation and Intercultural Communication (applied to economics, law and society) aims to train language mediators who possess solid language skills - combined with a sound knowledge of cultural studies and of the principles of economics, law, and sociology - and who are therefore capable of providing inter-linguistic

services in a variety of contexts, ranging from public and private institutions, to schools and vocational training centres, to companies and other organizations in which language mediation and intercultural communication are of paramount importance.

Expected learning outcomes

The course helps students acquire solid practical language skills in at least two languages besides Italian, backed up by a thorough grounding in theoretical aspects, particularly those relating to languages for special purposes. The course also offers a wide and in-depth introduction to the cultural aspects of each language studied, as well as covering areas like modern Italian literature, contemporary history, sociology, law, economics and geography. Students will acquire the skills needed to compare different social systems and understand the dynamics of intercultural communication. A broad outline of the legal systems in force in today's world is also provided. Additionally, the course offers an introduction to the main themes of macro and microeconomics and the way individual markets work by examining key concepts underlying production, trade and consumption. The theory and methods of human geography, particularly those aspects involved in globalisation, will also be introduced.

Professional profile and employment opportunities

Graduates from the degree programme in Language Mediation and Intercultural Communication (applied to economics, law and society) will find career opportunities in all areas involving international relations, both at the interpersonal level and in corporate contexts (foreign relations, import/export departments, employment in the foreign offices of Italian companies, or in the offices of foreign companies in Italy), public services, and tourism and related sectors of the hospitality industry. Further opportunities are available in document search activities – both at national and at international level –, drafting memos, reports, minutes and other types of correspondence in a foreign language as well as Italian. The publishing sector also offers career prospects, ranging from the translation of semi-specialised texts in the domains of economics, law, sociology and cultural studies, to tourism, art publishing and journalism in general. Careers prospects exist wherever language mediation and intercultural communication activities occur in both the corporate sphere and public institutions. Additional employment opportunities are provided by partnership initiatives within the framework of international bodies and organisations, and by involvement in national and/or international projects (both at a European and at a supra-European level) requiring solid linguistic and cultural skills alongside a firm grasp of the principles of economics, sociology or law.

Initial knowledge required

For A.Y. 2022-23, Year I of the programme is not available and admissions will not open. Consequently, Years II and III will not be available in A.Y. 2023-24 and A.Y. 2024-25, respectively.

Additional learning requirements (OFA) and remedial coursework

Please note that any OFA must be met within Year I. Should a student fail remedial assessments, their academic career will be suspended at the end of Year I. Those enrolled in 2021-22 with unmet additional learning requirements may not sit for any exams after 28 February 2023.

Graduate and transfer students

Graduate and transfer students, whether from this or another University, may only be admitted to years subsequent to Year I. Information on how and when to apply for transfer will be posted to the programme web page.

The application for academic records assessment must attach a self-certified transcript of records (specifying exam dates, grades, credits and subject areas).

Compulsory attendance

Attendance is strongly recommended.

Internship criteria

Students must undertake an internship at a company, educational institution, publishing house or another organization in Italy or abroad requiring advanced language and cultural mediation skills.

Degree programme final exams

Upcoming graduates are required to sit for a final exam before earning their degree in Language Mediation and Intercultural Communication (applied to the economic, legal and social fields). This exam, worth 9 credits, consists of presenting and discussing a written paper, about 30-50 pages long, on a topic related to a curricular subject for which the student has earned at least 6 CFU.

To sit for the final exam, possibly in a foreign language, the student must have earned 171 credits.

EXPERIENCE OF STUDY ABROAD AS PART OF THE TRAINING PROGRAM

The University of Milan supports international mobility by providing its students with the opportunity to spend study and internship periods abroad. It is a unique chance to enrich your educational path in a new exciting environment.

The agreements entered into by the University with over 300 universities from the 27 EU member countries under the European Erasmus+ programme allow regularly enrolled students to carry out part of their studies at one of the partner universities or to undertake internships at companies, training and research centres and other organizations.

Similar international mobility opportunities are provided outside Europe, through agreements with a number of prestigious institutions.

Study and internships abroad

Within the framework of the Erasmus programme, 58 exchange agreements are in place, covering 19 countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Estonia, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Malta, Norway, the Netherlands, Portugal, Poland, Rumania, Spain, Sweden, United Kingdom, plus Switzerland, which participates in the Erasmus + programme as a partner country. Additionally, Erasmus traineeship agreements have also been signed with companies and institutions in some of the above-mentioned countries.

Additionally, a number of exchange agreements are in place with partner universities in non-European countries. Under these agreements, students have the opportunity to attend classes and take exams at partner institutions. Such activities and exam results may be validated in full or in part, with the corresponding credits concurring to fulfil the requirements for the attainment of the degree. Courses are typically offered in the areas of languages and the humanities, and are available in the following partner institutions:

Besides the Erasmus exchange agreements, the Course also has one double degree program in place whereby participating students earn degrees from both institutions:

- The double degree program with AMU - Aix Marseille Université, awards students a degree in Language Mediation and Intercultural Communication issued from UNIMI and a degree in Langues étrangères appliquées - LEA, issued by AMU. How to participate in Erasmus mobility programs

The students of the University of Milan can participate in mobility programmes, through a public selection procedure.

Ad hoc commissions will evaluate:

- Academic career
- the candidate's proposed study programme abroad
- his/her foreign language proficiency
- the reasons behind his/her application

Call for applications and informative meetings

The public selection for Erasmus+ mobility for study generally begins around February each year with the publication of a call for applications specifying destinations and requirements. Regarding the Erasmus+ Mobility for Traineeship, the University of Milan usually publishes two calls a year enabling students to choose a destination defined by an inter-institutional agreement or to find a traineeship position on their own.

The University organizes informative meetings to illustrate mobility opportunities and rules for participation.

Erasmus+ scholarship

The European Union grants the winners of the Erasmus+ programme selection a scholarship to contribute to their mobility costs, which may be supplemented by the University funding for disadvantaged students.

Language courses

Students who pass the selections for mobility programmes can benefit from intensive foreign language courses offered each year by the University Language Centre (SLAM).

COURSE PROGRESSION REQUIREMENTS

In the first year students choose two languages and their respective cultures, which will be studied for the entire three years of the course. To sit the exams of the next year, (e. g., Language II or Culture II), students must pass the exams for the preceding year (e.g., Language I or Culture I).

As regards the choice of the Culture component, note that:

1. French language students can choose between French Culture and Francophone cultures. This choice has to be made starting in the first year and adhered to for the whole of the degree course;
2. in their second year of the Culture component, Students of English language can choose between British Culture II, Anglo-american Culture and Anglophone Cultures. British Culture I serves as an obligatory preparatory course for Anglo-American Culture and Cultures of English Speaking Countries;
3. students of Spanish can choose between Spanish Culture and Cultures of Spanish Speaking Countries. The choice must be made starting from the first year and maintained for all three years of the degree course.
